Introduction

Throughout the nineteenth century, this group of families, descended from William Skipworth of Little Steeping, and his wife Jane BRIGGS, have remained quite close to their point of origin. William was most likely an agricultural labourer like his son William of Swaby, though we have no information on that point. Through the first half of the century they continued to be agricultural labourers, but later we find them branching out into small businesses as diverse as bricklayer and confectioner as new opportunities arose associated with the urbanisation of the population. It was not until the early twentieth century that significant dispersal occurred.

The census records show that it was quite common for the children of agricultural labourers to be away from home in their early teens, as farm boys or domestic servants. Where the relationship to head of household in a census is given as servant this means a live-in employee. It could be a domestic servant in the modern sense, but it could also be a labourer or a trade employee. The original census image will often clarify ambiguous cases.

A map of their area appears on the following page. The chief villages to look for on the map are Little Steeping, Swaby, Ashby by Partney, Theddlethorpe, Louth, Thoresway.

Thoresway is on the outer fringe of this family's area and could cause some confusion. It has a boundary with Rothwell parish where an unrelated family of Skipworths were farming at that period. Some records of the Rothwell family are recorded at Thoresway. The census makes it quite clear however, that Richard of Thoresway was born at Swaby. He was not from the Rothwell family.

To guide the reader through the five generations a chart is included showing all descendants mentioned in the text. One of the possibilities for the relationship of these families to other groups of Skipworths is shown at the top of this chart.

The chart shows William and Jane with 9 children, 23 grandchildren, 13 great grandchildren and 15 gt gt grandchildren. However, it should be noted that only male lines have been followed beyond the first generation. If female line descendants had been included as well the numbers would have been greater. Never-the-less the smaller numbers in this family compared with other families in this series is noticeable. This can be attributed to the chance that only one son in the second generation established a family whose male line carried into the second half of the 19th century. Maybe the fact that one of the gt gt grandsons produced 10 sons will have carried them through the twentieth century without the surname becoming extinct.

Apparent inconsistencies have arisen in these and other Skipworth families through individuals changing the way their names are expressed. The order of Christian names may have been reversed, or a second Christian name added, or adopted as the sole name. Occasionally, a different name altogether seems to have been substituted.

There are also apparent inconsistencies in the places of birth as stated in the census returns, particularly when a young person has left home. Either the person filling in the census return was not accurately informed, or the person remembered the place they grew up, not the place of birth.


Transcription errors have crept in, both in compiling the original returns, and in the production of modern indexes. However, unless otherwise indicated in the notes, I am reasonably confident of the identifications because of the relative rarity of the surname and the completeness of the census coverage every ten years.

Inconsistencies in ages are probably due in the main to difficulties in reading the census returns.



First Generation

1. William SKIPWORTH of Little Steeping, was born about 1757 and was buried age 58 on 2 May 1815 in Little Steeping, Lincolnshire, UK.1

> William's probable descent from Thomas SKIPWORTH and Alice EVISON is discussed in my paper "Skipworths from around Spilsby". 17 Thomas and Alice were buried at Little Steeping, in 1795 and 1800 respectively, and it is likely they were living with or close to this son William.

> There was a William Skipworth baptised at Grimoldby on 19 Oct 1760, youngest of the 10 children of Thomas Skipwith and Elizabeth Crowston. [The overlaps in their families makes it impossible for this to be the same Thomas who married Alice Evison in 1745.] However the evidence in favour of Thomas and Alice being this William's parents seems to me more convincing.

William married Jane BRIGGS on 12 Mar 1781 in Little Steeping.² Both parties marked the marriage record instead of signing, the witnesses were not family members. Jane was born about 1759 and died aged 55 on 11 May 1814 in Little Steeping.¹ The Stamford Mercury noted on 27 May 1814: "Died suddenly at Little Steeping Mrs Skipworth", at a time when relatively few people were accorded death notices in the papers.

William's eldest son Samuel left a will (1856) in which he passed his copyhold house and land to his brother Thomas. The following advertisement suggests that this small-holding had come to Samuel from the previous generation, named as James Skipwith in the advertisement. I believe that the occupier was actually William Skipworth, as James Skipwith is not a name that has been found in the Little Steeping records.

Lloyd's Evening Post (London, England), Wednesday, September 4, 1776 To be sold, an estate at Little Steeping, part freehold part copyhold, consisting of several farms in the respective tenures of Mr William Brickhill (principal tenant), James Skipwith, and Robert Lawrence at yearly rents amounting together to £134 net of taxes etc.

Second Generation (Children)

2. Maria SKIPWORTH (William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised on 26 Feb 1782 in Little Steeping.3 and buried there, aged 24 on 21 Aug 1806. 10

Maria had a daughter

Prudence Maria SKIPWORTH 1800 - after 1850 10 i. Refer to page 11

3. Sophia SKIPWORTH (William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised on 3 Feb 1784 in Little Steeping.³

Sophia married Samuel BURN or BOURN on 15 May 1805 in Willoughby with Sloothby, Lincolnshire.⁴ They had 6 children baptised at Willoughby between 1807 and 1825.

- 4. Samuel SKIPWORTH of Little Steeping (William of Little Steeping¹) was born about 1788 in Little Steeping, and was buried age 68 on 27 Aug 1856 in Little Steeping.¹
 - 1788: parents guessed to be William and Jane as he fits well in that family. Thomas and Hannah of Little Steeping are the other possible parents, but no record of them producing children later than 1776 has been found.
 - 1841: age approx 50, with wife Frances at Little Steeping
 - 1851: age 63 born Steeping, cottager living alone at Little Steeping.
 - 1856: Coroner's inquest suicide due to insanity (hanged himself after taking laudanum)
 - 1856: Will of Samuel Skipworth of Little Steeping, yeoman made 23 Aug 1856. To bro Thomas S of Ashby all copyhold house and land at Little Steeping and all chattels but to pay wife Elizabeth 50 pounds and give her one bed and bedding and all linen which she had when they were married. Also Thomas to put in hand a stone in churchyard at Little Steeping to his first wife Frances. Proved 22 Sep 1856 by Thomas Skipworth, testator died 25 Aug 1856. 16 There were apparently no surviving children.

Samuel married Frances MILNER on 13 Nov 1829 in Little Steeping.^{2, 15} Frances was born about 1794 and was buried age 49 on 19 Nov 1843 in Little Steeping. 1, 6

Samuel next married Elizabeth CARTER in 1851 in Spilsby RD,6 after the census. Elizabeth was born about 1807 and was buried age 50 on 23 Sep 1857 in Little Steeping.¹

- 5. Charlotte SKIPWORTH (William of Little Steeping1) was baptised on 8 Jul 1793 in Little Steeping,³ and was buried age 27 on 21 Jul 1820 at Firsby.¹ (between Irby and Little Steeping)
- 6. Thomas SKIPWORTH of Ashby (William of Little Steeping1) was born about 1794 in Little Steeping, and was buried there age 66 on 22 Jun 1860.1
 - 1794: parents guessed, same comments as recorded for his brother Samuel above
 - 1841: age approx 45, with children Elizabeth, Fanny, Ann, Maria. (wife Ann not at home)
 - 1851: age 58 born Steeping, ag lab at Ashby, with wife Ann, Maria 12, and Mary Skelton 87, visitor, widow, pauper.
 - 1856: Parish Clerk, Ashby by Partney Kelly's Directory
 - 1856: brother and heir of Samuel, inherited house and copyhold land at Little Steeping, probably moved to Little Steeping at this time, hence burial at Steeping.

Thomas married Ann SHELTON/SKELTON on 18 Dec 1817 in Ashby by Partney.² Ann was born about 1794 in Little Steeping and was buried there age 74 on 29 Dec 1868.^{1, 6}

- 1841: Not at home
- 1851: age 57 born Steeping, with husband, daughter Maria, and her elderly mother
- 1861: age 66 born Holby, Lincolnshire, widow and head of household, of Railway Tavern Little Steeping, freehold cottager [presumably the inheritance from Samuel] with daughter Ann and 2 grandsons, John BOURNE age 12 and John age 3.

No male line grandsons have been found for Thomas & Ann, so the name may be extinct in this line.

7. William SKIPWORTH of Swaby (William of Little Steeping1) was baptised on 23 Apr 1796 in Little Steeping³ and buried age 57 on 14 Oct 1853 in Swaby, Lincolnshire.¹

> William of Swaby is identified as the son of William and Jane of Little Steeping because of his stated birthplace "G. Steping" in 1851, though the age does not agree perfectly. Possibly the figure has been misread.

> 1832: William Skipworth, labourer, accused at Lincoln Assizes of setting fire to 4 stacks of corn, the property of Charles Hill of Sth Thoresby (which is close by Swaby). The court documents need examining to see if they state a parish for William. To have engaged a barrister for a full day's hearing must have been a considerable expense for this family, unless of course there was some labourer's organisation or benefactor supporting him.

LINCOLN, WEDNESDAY, MARCH 7.

CROWN COURT.—(Before Mr. Justice J. PARKE.)

William Skipworth, a day labourer, about the age of 35, was indicted for having feloniously and maliciously set fire to four stacks of corn belonging to a farmer, named Charles Hill, at South Thoresby, on the 10th of Aprillast.

Mr. N. CLARKE conducted the prosecution, and Mr. What Philes the defence.

WRITERURST the defence.

It appeared that the stacks of corn in question were set on fire about 9 or 10 o'clock at night, and on the following day the prisoner was apprehended on suspicion and carried before the justices. After examining all the witnesses who were examined to day, the magistrates were of opinion that there was not sufficient evidence against the prisoner to commit him for trial, and he was therefore discharged. Seven or eight months afterwards, a blacksmith of the name of Graves, who lived in the same village with the prisoner, about a mile from the in the same village with the prisoner, about a mile from the premises on which the fire took place, was committed to Louth jail on a charge of uttering a forged bank-note, and shortly afterwards a man named Rowson was committed on a charge of a similar nature. Graves having determined to come forward as a witness against Rowson, and hearing that Skipworth was about to come forward in his favour, immediately gave information that Skipworth was the person who had set Mr. Hill's stacks on fire, he, Graves, having seen him do so on the night of the 10th of April, as he was going to a public-house for some gin. His reason, he said, for not mentioning the circumstance before was because his wife told him not, for fear Shipworth, who was their neighbour, should be hanged. But she was now dead, and he was determined to tell the truth. The leading facts stated by the other witnesses, in corroboration of the story of Graves, were, that a man, resembling the prisoner in figure and dress, was seen that night coming from towards the fire, and skulked seen that night coming from towards the fire, and skulked away when spoken to; that when the alarm of fire was given away when spoken to; that when the alarm of fire was given in the prisoner's village, he stated that he saw "a shine" in the direction of Thoresby, although the witnesses could see none, nor did they think it possible to see it, because the village stood in a valley, and a steep hill stood between it and Thoresby; besides which, some loose expressions were used both before and after the fire by the prisoner, who first stated that the radicals would soon have a fire in this valley; and afterwards he expressed his opinion that the fires were the best things that ever occurred for the country, they would do great things that ever occurred for the country; they would do great good to the labourers, and procure them an increase of wages. There were some other minor points of suspicion spoken to, but the Jury, after an investigation that lasted from 9 o'clock in the morning until nearly 6 in the evening, returned a verdict of Not Guilty.

1838: age 42, married with 7 children, of Louth, tried at Lincoln Assizes for stealing milk, convicted and sentenced to 7 years for larceny Prison Hulk Register # 5210 Wm Skipworth age 42, married with 7 children, charged for stealing milk, able to read and write, agricultural lab, charged with arson and poaching, bad in every respect, transferred to ship Justitia moored at Woolwich. character - bad in every respect, also charged with arson and poaching.

1841: "age 40" in prison hulk on the Thames

1851: age 53 born G Steping, ag lab Swaby with wife Mary 47, children Henery, Fanny

William married **Jane TOWNEND** on 6 Mar 1821 in Swaby, both "of this parish", William signed and Jane marked the register.² Jane was born about 1800 and was buried age 45 on 27 May 1845 in Swaby. 1 She died of consumption. 14

1841: Jane aged about 40, Independent, living at Swaby with 6 children. The family is indexed Skipwith, and two of the baptisms are under Skipwith so it appears this was an accepted variant of their name. Jane's husband William is missing from the family, but he was apparently not dead as he reappeared in Swaby in 1851, following Jane's death, with a new wife Mary, and two of Jane's younger children.

Someone was supporting them, as Jane was able to declare herself independent, rather than pauper. William appears to have been in a prison hulk as indicated above. Had his absence been temporary Jane is more likely to have been listed as "wife".

William remarried Mary WOOD nee DISHMAN on I Oct 1845 at Louth Registry Office. 6, 14 Mary was born about 1804 in Blankney, Lincolnshire, and died after 1850.

8. Azubah SKIPWORTH (William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised on 8 Feb 1799 in Little Steeping,³ and was buried, age 16 of Steeping, on 1 Feb 1816 in Willoughby with Sloothby.¹

> Azubah may have gone to her sister Sophia BURN at Willoughby after her mother's death in 1814. Her father was to die three months after Azubah.

9. Henry SKIPWORTH of Ashby (William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised on 29 Dec 1801 in Little Steeping.³ Henry Skipworth died in North Adelaide aged 46 on 19 Feb 1849.

Henry married Jane ASHTON, widow, on 14 Jun 1824 in Ashby by Partney, Lincolnshire,² The family has not been found in the 1841 census of England and Wales.

Henry Skipworth emigrated to Sth Australia in 1840. He was aged over 35 and under 50 in the 1841 census of South Australia. Information from Biographical Index of South Australians 1836-1885, produced by SA Genealogy & Heraldry Society, is difficult to evaluate because information from official sources has been merged with details provided by families. The listing in Biographical Index reads: SKIPWORTH, Henry, (wife Jane), (Rebecca and Sarah)/ Jane and Hannah arrived 3 Oct 1840 on Baboo, from Liverpool. The meaning of the brackets in this listing is unknown

Sources most likely to assist in identifying this Henry are: Register of Emigrant Labourers applying for free passage to South Australia 1836-1841 PRO CO 386/149-151; also Manifests of Vessels arriving from Overseas 1838-42, SA Archives, GRG 41/8 (formerly A 743).

10. Prudence Maria SKIPWORTH (Maria SKIPWORTH 2, William of Little Steeping1) was baptised on 8 Mar 1800 in Little Steeping, no father named. The name Maria appeared in her marriage record, not in her baptism.

Prudence married Robert SMITH on 3 Apr 1834 in Hainton, Lincolnshire.⁵

- 11. Mary SKIPWORTH (Thomas of Ashby⁶, William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised on 8 Mar 1818 in Ulceby, Lincolnshire.8
 - 1851: age 34, born Firsby, unmarried housekeeper at Thornton Fen allotments
- 12. Elizabeth SKIPWORTH (Thomas of Ashby⁶, William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised on 27 May 1821 in Ashby by Partney.7

1861: age 25 b Ashby, ladies maid living with her mother at Little Steeping. Also present a 3 yr old grandson, John (no surname) who could be Ann's child, no

registration found.

18. Maria SKIPWORTH (Thomas of Ashby⁶, William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised on 16 May 1838 in Ashby by Partney.7

1841: age 3 at home

1851: age 12, at home with parents at Ashby

Maria married Abraham JACKLIN in 1856 in Louth RD.⁶ He was born on 25 Oct 1829 at Keddington, (son of Thomas and Rebecca), they had sons Thomas 1857, William 1862, George 1867. Thomas and William emigrated to Australia in 1872.11

19. Charles SKIPWORTH (William of Swaby⁷, William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised on 19 May 1822 in Swaby,9 and died aged 22 in January 1845, in Milbank Penitentiary, Westminster.6

1841: Not at home with family, not found in census, was he in prison?

1845: Death of Charles Skipworth, aged 22 by suicide, after being convicted of incendiarism at Swaby and sentenced to transportation.

SUICIDE OF CHARLES SKIPWORTH, THE LINCOLNSHIRE INCENDIARY .- This unhappy man, who was convicted at the Lincoln winter assizes of incendiarism on the farm of Mr. Edward Enderby, at Swaby, and sentenced to transportation for life, was conveyed, in pursuance of his sentence, to the Milbank Penitentiary, Westminster. Since his conviction, he has been very depressed, but did not, as far as we can learn, make any confession of his guilt. On Monday week, he terminated his existence by hanging himself with a skein of thread attached to the pipe of the gaslight in his cell. When discovered he was quite dead. On Wednesday, Mr. Higgs held an inquest on the body in prison, when the jury returned a verdict of "Temporary insanity." Skipworth was 22 years of age.

20. Richard Marshall SKIPWORTH (William of Swaby⁷, William of Little Steeping¹) was baptised [Marshall Skipwith] on 25 Nov 1824 in Swaby, 10 died at the age of 35 of diphtheria and typhus, ¹⁴ and was buried on 26 Jan 1859 in Thoresway, Lincolnshire.¹

1824: His maternal gt grandparents were Richard Townend and Mary Marshall. It was not usual among these Skipworths to use an ancestral name, possibly the Townends had money which allowed Jane to declare herself "independent" in the 1841 census. Could they also have paid for William's defence in court?

1841: age 15 at home with Jane at Swaby [Marshall Skipworth]

- 1851: age 19 ag lab for Edward Darcy at Thoresway, born Authorpe [Richard Skipworth] both age and birthplace incorrect in this entry as often happened when employers completed schedules for their labourers
- 1852: marriage at Thoresway [Richard Marshall Skipworth] also recorded at Usselby
- 1852: birth and death of son Henry at Thoresway

Ann had her first child at age 16 and was well advanced with her second pregnancy when she married Richard in 1852. We can only speculate on whether there had been opposition to this marriage.
